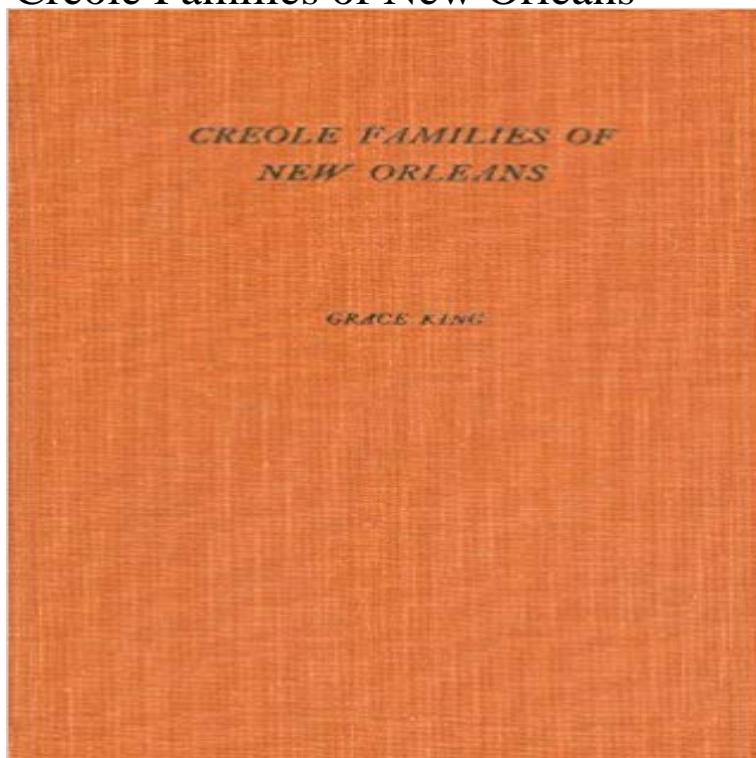


Creole Families of New Orleans
