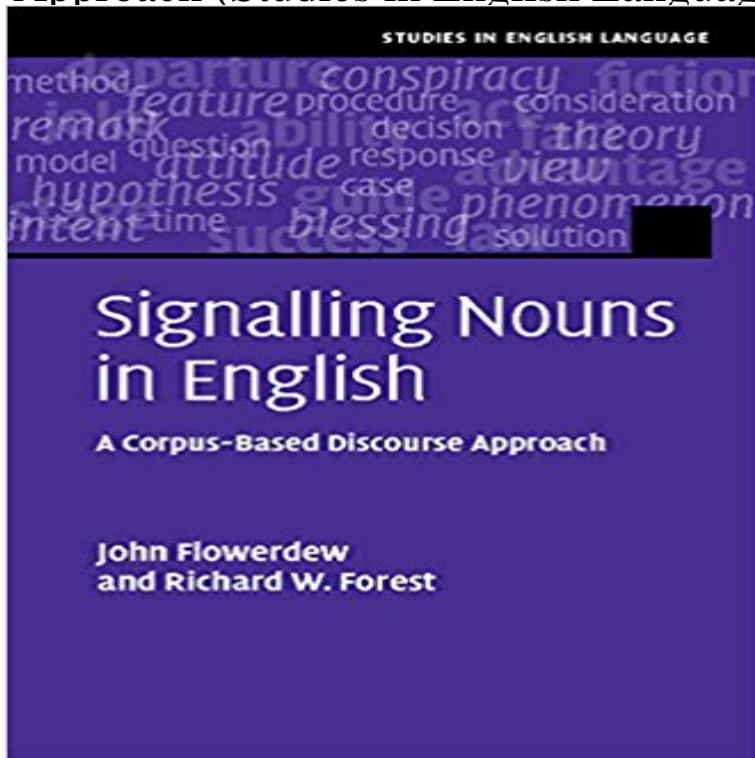


Signalling Nouns in Academic English: A Corpus-Based Discourse Approach (Studies in English Language)



Signalling nouns (SNs) are abstract nouns like problem, result, idea, and fact which are non-specific in their meaning when considered in isolation and specific in their meaning by reference to their linguistic context. SNs contribute to cohesion and evaluation in discourse.
